Progress on the supply chain control of reclaimed timber	 The Reclaimed Timber Association, leader of the Reclaimed Timber sub-working group, conducts field surveys in the northern, southern, central, north-eastern, eastern, and western regions of Thailand to collect the existing reclaimed timber supply chain control models. The project will produce a supply chain control of reclaimed timber and a capacity building plan for the reclaimed timber association by the end of the project in September 2020.
