Various Sections of the Establishment of Labour Court and Procedure Act, 1979 (including Section 37 and Section 39) refer to the importance of cases being processed promptly, however few specific time-frames are stated. Nonetheless, the Labour Court provisions are a key component of the Thai legal framework regulating worker's rights.
